

Remember, Remember, the 5th of November...

God always moves

Grassroots chaplaincy can transform community as Lizzy Cook in Wigan explains:

Over the last 18 months, a vision was started in Wigan—a call to bring chaplaincy into grassroots sport, for the church to be present.

Wigan is a town full of passion, especially when it comes to sport. It's a universal language that unites people from all walks of life. What began as a team of two chaplains has now grown into a committed group of eight (six having done the *Sports Chaplaincy* training), all carrying a heart to serve and support the local sporting community.


One of the places we serve is Laithwaite Park, one of 18 sites managed my Leisure United across the UK. Every Wednesday evening we shop up to walk, talk, listen, and pray. It's become clear that grassroots sport is a huge mission field. On average, around 500 people pass through the park on a Wednesday night. Over time, we've built a consistent and trusted presence. People now stop to talk, to share their lives, and to find comfort in a listening ear. Simply standing on the sidelines and offering a reassuring voice has become a quiet but powerful ministry.

But our work doesn't end at Laithwaite. We also serve at Highfield Cricket Club and are developing new connections with clubs in other sports like wrestling. Across each of these settings, we've seen how God is moving—connecting people, opening hearts, and drawing us together through sport. Every time we leave a club, we're reminded that showing up in faith and obedience allows God to create something bigger than we can see. Out team motto 'Spread the Gold' reflects this mission.

You'll see us in our golden hoodies, symbolising hope, light, and the presence of God in community. It's more than a slogan—it's a vision to see God's love spread across Wigan. And we're seeing it happen. New partnerships are emerging, both with sports clubs and with local churches. We're especially excited about our upcoming Young Disciple in Sport programme, where we'll train and mentor teenagers and young adults to become sports chaplains, planting seeds of faith, service, and discipleship across the borough.

Grassroots chaplaincy isn't always fast-moving. Sometimes, it can feel like slow work. But when we stay faithful—rooted in prayer and present in the community—we've seen that God moves—always!

Highfield Cricket Club

At the time of writing, we are just two weeks away from the AGM immediately followed by our annual Bonfire and Fireworks, a massive community event.

The outcome of the AGM is therefore not known, other than as advised at last year's meeting, Gary Speakman will be stepping down from the Chair role after 21 years in post. He reflected recently on that long period:

"I have always wanted the committee (and myself as Chair), to be judged by results, not by those on the field alone (although they are important), but by staying aligned with our values and strategic priorities; including our ground, junior set up and community.

What a stunning ground we have and what outstanding facilities we now have available for our members, visiting clubs and the community. We are indebted to our volunteer grounds team, led by Martin Gaskell.

The junior set up, from Allstars through to 18s has been crucial as it remains the best way of instilling and maintaining our culture, supported by another group of wonderful volunteer coaches. And the conveyor belt of talent from our juniors to senior teams has been strong, feeding directly into competitive senior teams over the last 20 years, including those that have secured promotions and won trophies.

Highfield as a place has a strong identity given its only really a hamlet, and the cricket club has arguably done as much as anyone over the last 100 years to raise that profile. Through its community engagement programmes, I believe that the cricket club has supercharged that over the last 20 years. The symbiotic relationship between the cricket club and community hall is a massive strength.

Community Engagement was always intended to be self-serving, a productive cycle, with engagement programmes and events attracting more players, parents, sponsors, umpires, scorers, coaches. That has been.

We have also had a relatively successful period on the field, with Premier league reached for the first time, plus a couple of cup wins in more recent times. Following our first ever promotion to the Premier league for the 2010 season, we were in the topflight for five of the following six seasons and then again in 2018 for one season, which some might say is a good example of a club punching above its weight! But we haven't been in the topflight for the last seven years, which is a bit disappointing, so we must look forward to being back there again in the future, stronger and better equipped for the challenges it brings.

It's been a privilege and an honour to be the Chairman of Highfield CC, succeeding Harold Gaskell a true legend of the club. It's not an easy role, especially for someone like me who wants to continuously improve and strengthen all aspects of the club, but I have been blessed to have great people around me and I think we have got more right than wrong over that long period and the club is in good shape with firm foundations. Personally, the centenary season in 2024 was a particular highlight, including the two cup final wins that year as well as the fundraising and build of the new scoring facility now carrying my name; as were the three promotions to the Premier League, and also being crowned best Sports Club in the Borough not once but twice, in 2010 and 2023, all great memories.

To all those who have supported me and the club over the last 21 years, a massive thank you. I remain a proud Honorary Life Member of Highfield CC and will always do what I can to support the club."

Many thanks are due to Carl and Adele Coupland, two of our voluntary Churchyard Maintenance team, for giving up a few hours on a Sunday to bring their jetwashing machine to clean the War Memorial at the back of church (the Lord and Sharmans 'Slipperworks' memorial). In the 45 years or so that I have worked on the graveyard, to my knowledge it is the first time in the 80 or so years since it was dedicated that it has been cleaned!). The memorial itself is grey granite and it stands on a base of beautiful pink sandstone which matches the Runcorn sandstone of which our church is built. Though one could not tell that until the grime of 80 or so years was removed.

I have asked for a faculty to be sought (permission) to move the memorial to a more visible site at the front of church, possibly on the site of the old notice board at the side of the front doors. I know that our local councillors are interested in this being done and they could doubtless assist in the physical aspects involved in doing so. As a Church we need permission from the Diocese before doing virtually anything to the building and its surrounds. Also the building is Grade Two * listed, putting additional safeguards in place. As it protects our much-loved building, we can have little problem with this. Unfortunately it always seems to take forever before a faculty is granted and it is now at least 12 months since I first asked our Churchwarden to apply for one.

Over to you Martin! I am certain many people are unaware that the Memorial exists as its siting is not in the most visible of places.

The application form for Reception Intake 2026 has now gone live.

Parents/Carers should apply online, the online application form can be accessed via our web page. If you haven't used the portal to apply for a school place before you will need to register and create an account before you are able to complete the application form. Parents/Carers must apply to the local authority you pay council tax too (you can still apply for schools in other areas on the application form). Primary school admissions (wigan.gov.uk)

All applications, supplementary forms and any additional documents must be submitted by the closing date of 15 January 2026. Any applications received after the closing date will be classed as late (this also includes changes of preferences and if you move house after the closing date).





Andrew was one of the first disciples of Jesus, and the very first to bring someone else to Christ – his own brother. Like many fervent Jews at the time Andrew and an unnamed companion had been drawn to the prophet John the Baptist. When one day John pointed out Jesus to Andrew and his friend, and described him as the 'Lamb of God', the two young men assumed that the next stage of their spiritual search was about to unfold. So as Jesus made off, they followed him.

When Jesus turned and asked them what they were 'seeking', all they could come up with was a lame enquiry about his current place of residence: 'where are you staying?'

The reply of Jesus was the most straight-forward invitation anyone can receive: 'Come and see'. So they did, and the results of their response were life changing. For Andrew brought his brother, Peter, to Jesus, and soon the little apostolic band who would carry the message of Jesus to the whole world was formed. And right at the front of the column, as it were, was Andrew, the first


disciple of Jesus.
